A BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF ABSOLAM STRICKLAND
OF DUPLIN COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

Duplin County was formed in 1750 from New Hanover. Somewhere in or near this area, and about this time, Absolam was born. We do not know who his parents were, but chances are strong that they were part of the large group of Stricklands that were moving into this area from Edgecombe, Johnston, and other counties just north in the 1740's and 1750's. There are less than ten documented clues to tell us who Absolam was.

In 1790, Absolam was recorded in the Duplin County census with two females, a wife and daughter (most likely), and four sons under 16. From this we must surmise that he had been married no more than 16 years; so, it would appear he was born about 1750 and married about 1774 at age 24. There is no evidence to indicate that he served either side during the Revolutionary War. In 1800, he had five sons, four under 16 and one between 16 and 20. Absolam was over 45; his wife, Sarah, was under 45; and his two daughters were listed as one under 10 and the other 10 to 16.

Absolam died intestate in 1809 in Duplin. His son, Matthew, was appointed administrator of his estate. The estate papers indicate that he was deeply in debt at the time of his death. They also tell us he was survived by his wife, Sarah.

The four Stricklands that bought items when his inventory was sold in January of 1810 were: Matthew, Richard, Mahala, and Hesa. Presumably these were his sons and daughters. We have only two other methods of determining his other children. These are later census records and deeds; but, these are speculative at best.

In the Duplin 1810 census, one year after Absolam died, Matthew and Richard appear with their families for the first time. Both were between 26 and 45 years old. These two appear to definitely be Absolam's two older sons.

In 1820, only one Strickland is shown as residing in Duplin--Ephraim, age 26 to 45. He is presumed to be the third son of Absolam. We do not know where the other sons were in 1820. Perhaps they were not counted.

The best candidates for the remaining two sons are Jessa and Charles. They were both listed as over 45 years of age in the 1830 Duplin census. Richard again appears in 1830, but Matthew does not. In Matthew's place is his probable widow, Catherine. Another person who might possibly have been Absolam's son is the young Absolam that appears in the 1810 Cumberland County census. This, however, seems more likely to

be a nephew than a son.

The first record of Absolam buying land in Duplin is dated 20 January 1793 and involves 140 acres. There is an earlier deed involving 100 acres dated 21 April 1789, but this was made to Sarah Strickland and Richard Strickland, jointly. We must presume this is Absolam's wife and son since his name is not mentioned, for there was no other Sarah or Richard known to be in Duplin at that time. In 1795, Absolam and Sara issued "An instrument of privileges on 100 acres" to Peter Carleton who, in turn, on the same day conveyed the same land to Charles Strickland. This was probably an instrument to avoid lein, and is another indication of Charles being Absolam's son.

Absolam is also spelled as Absolom and Absalom in various records. Because Absolam used the names Matthew and probably Jesse for his sons, and, due to a probable nephew named Absolam in a nearby county, there has been speculation that Absolam was the brother of Jesse Strickland in Cumberland County circa 1750-1815; and, a brother of Matthew who lived first in Sampson and later in Cumberland circa 1755-1829. This Matthew was the husband of Pereby.

It is regrettable that much misinformation has been distributed over the years about this man Absolam. It is hoped that this report will help clear the air.

Some of the men who served in the reserves had previously served in the Confederate Army, but were discharged due to wounds or ill health. These reserve units supposedly only served within the state of Georgia.

A LETTER FROM ENGLAND

Dear Mr. Dunn,

Reference your July 29 letter I can state categorically that the Strickland forebears you give are not connected with my Sizergh Stricklands. We are solidly recorded back to our first adoption of the name in 1179, and before that date. Though we have lost track of the descendants of one or two possible younger sons back in the 13th & 14th centuries, and there is always the occasional illegitimate query, we do know of every descendant from say 1550 onwards perfectly. The John who fled from Cromwell to America is not ours, or known to me. Nor does he seem to be at all related to the Light-haugh (Furness, Lancashire) Stricklands who were yeoman farmers there from 15th - 19th centuries, & who have many descendants in the USA, Canada, Australia & New Zealand. Agnes Strickland, an authoress of historical novels in the 19th century, was of that family (though born in London) and is responsible for a lot of nonsense in her books which some Stricklands overseas think is true. She claimed kinship with us, which was not so.

I have heard previous reference to your family of Strickland. In 1977 an American lady visited here for 15 minutes (it takes a good hour to go round properly!) and gave me a paper quoting "your" Stricklands & their character oddities & giving the descendants of Jacob (b. 1741 m. Priscilla? d. in Georgia in 1804) but not giving the descendants of (your) Solomon or of Isaac or Henry or Matthew. My lady visitor was a Mrs. Jacobs nee Strickland, from Louisiana, aged say 75. I know no more. If you can find her she may help you.

ABSTRACT OF DEED FROM ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY, VIRGINIA

Copy of deed submitted by Lyle Sharp

Isle of Wight County, Virginia

6 June 1687 Deed from Mathew & Elizabeth Strickland to Wm. Evans:

MATHEW STRICKLAND of the Lower Parish of Isle of Wight County and ELIZABETH, his wife, to WILLIAM EVANS of the Upper Parish of said county. 800 acres in the Lower Parish of Isle of Wight County "lying & being between the Main Swamp of King Sail and the Beaver Dam Branch...containing in the whole 902 acres granted unto MATHEW STRICKLAND by a Patent bearing date of 26 September 1678"...except for 102 acres...reserved...to be situate on the South Side of the Beaver Dam Swamp & Bounded by Kinsale Swamp on the East side according to the Bounds in a Lease for 99 years by the said MATHEW STRICKLAND left unto THOMAS JONES bearing the Date - the 6 day of November 1682."

B. 1768; d. 1829; m. Sarah Perley, b. 1774; d. 1842. He lived on what we call the Job Chase farm, about thirty rods east of the present buildings, where the foundation of the house and barn can still be seen.

His children were: JOHN, b. 1774 (Ed. note: this is obviously a typographical error. It possibly should be 1794.) d. 1867. ISAAC, b. 1797; d. 1886. SAMUEL P., b. 1801. HASTINGS, b. 1803; m. Clarinda Brettun, d. 1889 (Bangor). LEE, b. 1806, d. 1873.

He is so closely connected with Brettun's Mills and its business interests, that his good deeds and kindly interest toward his neighbors will never be forgotten.

D. 1886, aged 89; m. Martha Monroe, d. 1872, aged 73. He and his brothers, Hastings, were both in the "Aroostook War." The Major told the writer that after they got back to Augusta, the officers all made themselves heroes. It was here that the Major smoked his first cigar with direful result, and never again did he hanker for the weed. He lived on the Sam Boothby farm near Barlett's Corner, when he was married, but soon removed to Brettun's Mills, where he lived in several places. He kept the "Tavern" for many years and its hall was used for balls, levees, town meetings, court trials, shows and religious meetings. Children: (3d Gen.)

FRANCES, m. _____ Woodman. They owned a plantation near Vicksburg, Miss., and Gen. Grant's famous canal, made to isolate the city, was dug through this property; this fact and

DO YOU KNOWSTRICKLAND-COuset/COWSERT

Rayburn G. Pyle, Jr., P. O. Box 5704, Shreveport, LA 71105: Seeking parents, brothers, sisters of MARTHA ANN MELISSA COuset/COWSERT, b. 23 Apr 1840, GA (possibly Troup Co), who m. DAVID LOYD STRICKLAND on 15 Nov 1865 in Randolph Co, AL. Her mother, Mattie COuset (COWSERT?), was so large that a special carriage was built for transport. In early part of Civil War in Atlanta, GA, she was on a platform in a park, was weighed on a cotton-bale scale with some 2,000 CSA recruits in audience, was found to be heavier than normal bale (550 lbs.). Only lived to age 42. One daughter, Alzada, (age 12) was living with sister MARTHA & DAVID STRICKLAND and family in Knox Co, TN, in 1870 census, was not with them in 1880 back in AL. I received the above items about great-great-grandmother Mattie COuset/COWSERT at a family reunion at Dublin, TX, in June 1979. The only Atlanta newspaper available is Southern Confederacy for 1862, probably too late to tell me much. Will appreciate any information or suggestions.

PRICE-PARKER

Rayburn G. Pyle, Jr., P. O. Box 5704, Shreveport, LA 71105: Seeking parents, brothers, sisters of ANDERSON ALEXANDER (ALEX) PRICE, b. 10 Oct 1849, GA, m. MARTHA MARTIAL (MATTIE) PARKER, 11 Dec 1872, Harris Co, GA. Believe parents were JESSE (age 35) and MARY (age 22) PRICE in Americus, Sumter Co, GA, 1850 census, with SARAH (age 4), WILLIAM (age 2), and ANSEM or ANSERN (age 6/12). By 1860, children were orphaned-- need probate, guardianship records. In 1860 census in Americus, living with MALCOMB BASS family were: WILLIAM C. (age 12), C. A. (male, age 6), and JAMES R. (age 5), all PRICE children. Were these children of JESSE & MARY PRICE? Will gladly share PRICE-PARKER-STRICKLAND family data I have.

STRICKLAND

Miss Casey W. Arnette, 1848 Derrill Dr., Decatur, GA 30032: Does anyone have information on JOHN & MARY "Milly" STRICKLAND in GA? JOHN, MILLY and daughter, LEVINA, are in the 1840 Macon Co, GA, census. In the 1850 Macon Co census, they are living with THOMAS W. & REBECCA ARCHER STRICKLAND. JOHN was b. 1767 in SC. MARY (Dungworth?) was b. about 1776.

STRICKLAND

Brenda Bailey, 216 Crescent Rd, Aliceville, AL 35442: I want information about BRINKLEY STRICKLAND, b. 1785 NC, and his connection to ABEL STRICKLAND & OBEDIAH STRICKLAND (brothers). ABEL had 5 sons who moved from NC in the 20's & 30's. 3 came to Pickens Co, AL; and my grandfather BRINKLEY came with them. Some of ABEL's sons who came were: KINSBIRD, KINDRED & KINUEL. KINSMAN & KINYERD did not come to AL. KINSMAN stayed in NC and KINYERD was in Savannah, GA, in 1821. I have ABEL's will which lists these 5 sons. OBEDIAH is ABEL's brother and executor.

REDING-STRICKLAND

Evelyn Hall Marshall, 1520 Farnell Ct. #325, Decatur, GA 30033: Need information on SARAH REDING STRICKLAND, b. 12 Jan 1837, d. 30 Oct 1917, m. ROBERT ELLISON LUCAS on 5 July 1854. Robert b. 4 Oct 1832, d. 24 Sept 1907; both buried at Little Ogeechee Baptist Church, Oliver, GA. Had 13 children. Some were: FLORENCE ADELLA, ARGENE EUPHRASIA, VALERIA ELIZABETH, JOHN WESLEY, JULIUS STRICKLAND, LAURA WESLEY and MONTGOMERY LUCAS. Must have raised family in Effingham, Bulloch & Screven and surrounding GA counties. The 1850 Screven Co census shows: L. M. STRICKLAND (age 49, b. SC); ANN (wife, 48, b. GA); SARAH R. (age 13); JOHN W. (age 10); LEWIS M. (age 6). The "Reding" must be a surname. I have found nothing on it.
