No Stricklands appeared in the indices for the rolls of either the Creeks or the Seminoles as of this enrollment, nor on freedmen's rolls of the Choctaws, Cherokees or Chickasaws. The dates of approval of the rolls by the Department of the Interior do not equate with the earlier census dates, that were not given as part of the roll information. It appears that all with the same census card number are from the same household.

SOLOMON STRICKLAND OF HENRY COUNTY, GEORGIA

Solomon Strickland, son of Solomon and Amy Pace Strickland of Madison County, Georgia, was born sometime between 1766 and 1770 in North Carolina. Several printed sources list him as a Revolutionary soldier, but I have yet to locate a record of military service and feel these sources may be referring to his father's service. He lived in Wilkes County, Georgia, in 1790 according to the 1790 Wilkes County Tax Digest, and put in a claim for stolen horses in Elbert County in 1802. He was given land in Elbert County by his father through a "Deed of Gift" in 1804. Though this "Deed of Gift" is no longer extant it is referred to in a later "Deed of Gift" written by his father in Madison County, Georgia, October 28, 1813 and November 5, 1813.(1) Solomon was still in Elbert County when he drew land in Baldwin County in the 1807 Georgia Land Lottery.(2)

Solomon Strickland was one of the first settlers in old Randolph County (now Jasper County), Georgia. The earliest record of him in Jasper is in May, 1808, six months after the county was formed from a part of Baldwin County.(3) Evidently his Baldwin County land became a part of the new county of Randolph. On page 10 of Jasper County Deed Book 1, a list of eight names, titled "Stock Marks" dated May 4, 1808, includes Solomon Stricklin. His name is on a deed dated November 26, 1808, as a commissioner for Randolph (Jasper) County.(4) By July, 1812, Solomon had become a Justice of Inferior Court.(5) Military records at the Georgia Department of Archives & History show Solomon served as a Private in Capt. Joshua Hagerty's Company, Jasper County, in November 1813.(6)

The 1820 Georgia Census lists him as Solomon Strickun livign in Jasper County. From 1808 to 1821, his name appears numerous times in Jasper County records, as well as on deeds in Habersham and Baldwin Counties.

Solomon lived in Jasper County until the formation of Henry County on May 15, 1821. In 1921, Wiley A. Clements compiled and printed a booklet entitled, History of Henry County - May 1821 - 1921.(7) The following information is an excerpt from this publication:

"The earliest settlers came mainly from the counties of Morgan, Walton, Putnam, and Jasper, and scattered over a broad area. The main point of entrance to the county was at the convergence of two Indian trails at a place on the Ocmulgee River, which was later given the name of Key's Ferry after one of the earliest settlers, a name which has spread to a road through the county, and to a street through the county site. This road was part of the stage coach line between McDonough and Madison...

Among the very first to come to the County were John Glenn, Solomon Strickland, and Wiley Heflin who settled on the Towaliga River...

On December 24, 1821, an act was passed by the legislature which provided for the election of five Justices of the Inferior Court who should define the militia districts of the county, provide for the election of officers for the county, and choose the county site. William Harkins, David Castleberry, Cheedle Cochran, Solomon Strickland, William McKnight, Charles Gates, Sr., and Lee Jeffers were named as commissioners to hold the election for the justices."(8)

In the Historical Collections of Georgia, Rev. George White lists Col. S. Strickland as one of the early settlers of the county. (9) Rev. White's brief description of Henry County includes a list of the first Superior Court Grand Jurors:

"The 1st Superior Court was held 10th June 1822, at the house of William Ruff, Judge Clayton presiding. The names of the Grand Jurors were,- William Jackson, Wm. Maline, James Sellers, James Pate, Thomas Abercrombie, C. Cochran, G. Gay, Wm. Wood, Willie Terrill, Jethro Barnes, Robert Shaw, James Colwell, John Brooks, F. Pearson, Wm. McKnight, B. Lasseter, Jacob Hinton, Jackson Smith, S. Strickland."

From a list of the "Members of the General Assemblies of Georgia, 1777-1958," (10) we find Solomon Strickland was elected the first Representative from Henry County in the year 1822. He served this two-year term alone, and in 1825 was elected along with John Griffin, evidently to fill a vacancy left by Thomas C. Bennine.

Military Records at the Georgia Department of Archives & History list Solomon Strickland as a Colonel in Henry County from July 17, 1823 to April 20, 1824. For the rest of his life, he was referred to by many as 'Col. Strickland.' (11)

It is apparent Solomon was a fairly wealthy man, and one who was respected by his acquaintances. During this period of time, a man's wealth was primarily judged by the amount of land and the number of slaves he owned. In the Henry County 1831 Tax Digest, Solomon is listed as owning 14 slaves and 500 acres of 2nd quality land (Lot 114) on the Towaliga River, as well as owning "1 big carriage." Not everyone owned a carriage, so perhaps this is another indication of his wealth. Lot 114 was his "home" or main plantation. The 1831 Tax Digest shows 1500 acres of 3rd quality land (Lot 232) on the Towaliga River was his also. A check of a land lot map in Henry County may show Lot 232 to be the property referred in Solomon's will as "the Island Plantation, separated from my home plantation socalled by Wolf Creek..." (12)

The 1837 Henry County Tax Digest states Solomon still owned 500 acres (Lot 114) on the Towaliga River, and 11 slaves. In his will of August 1843, he names 18 slaves as gifts to his wife and children, but adds, "I give to my son, Thomas J. Strickland, the Negroes not already disposed of." This indicates he owned more than 18 slaves at the time of his death.

The records in the Henry County Ordinary's office show that on September 4, 1837, Solomon Strickland, Sr., applied for guardianship of his grandchildren, and it was approved by the court. He was "hereby appointed Guardian of the persons and property of Frances Eliza, Mary Ann Paulina, Nancy Susan, Enoch Solomon and Barnabas Bedford Strickland, minors of Bedford Strickland, deceased." (13) He had been granted temporary guardianship March 30, 1837. A voucher on the estate of Bedford Strickland, dated December 30, 1837, lists "To Board, clothing & washing of" Enoch S., Barnabas B., and Frances E. Strickland for four and a half months. This voucher also states, "Maryann P. Strickland was kept by her mother and friends free of charge. Nancy Susan Strickland is deceased and no charge."

No record has been found of Solomon's marriage to the mother or mothers of his children. Tradition says he married (1) Frances Diamond and (2) Peggy Diamond. It is believed he was married to his first wife just prior to 1800. He probably married his second wife (if, in fact, he married a second time) before moving to Baldwin County. His wife (Frances or Peggy) was still living in 1830, but died sometime prior to the 5th of June, 1839, when Solomon married Hulda Ann Hardwick of Butts County, Georgia. (14) Solomon and Hulda Ann had no children.

Solomon's home plantation is located just across the Spalding County line on GA Highway 155 and Teamon Road. The old family cemetery, in a field across Hwy. 155 from the original Strickland home, is believed to be the burial site of Solomon. During his lifetime, this property was in Henry County, but, in 1851, became part of the newly formed Spalding County.

Wiley Jones James, Solomon's grandson, in a letter dated November 27, 1919, de-

scribes Solomon as very eccentric and relates the following information:

"Two travelers spent the night with him; one was very talkative and the other one quiet. Next morning when they were ready to leave, the one who did the talking asked, 'How much do I owe you?' 'Nothing,' was the reply. The one who didn't talk asked, 'How much is my bill?' 'One dollar, sir,' was the reply. 'Why do you make that difference?' asked the traveler. 'I charge you a dollar because you wouldn't talk,' was the reply."

Mr James gave a further general description of the Strickland family. "The Strickland family are scattered everywhere and all claim to be kin-folks. They cannot be excelled for bravery, but are not as strident and cautious as the James family. Politically, they were Whigs, and hated to be defeated on anything and loved their ancestry. Their religion was divided between the Baptist and Methodist. My Mother had three brothers who were missionary Baptist ministers. Their names were Barnabas, Ephraim and Bedford. My grandfather was Colonel in the Indian War. He acquired considerable wealth, and died in 1840, and is buried seven miles from Griffin on the Towaliga River on the road to McDonough, Ga., once Henry County, But now Spalding County. The James and Stricklands have fought in all the wars from the Revolution down to the present."

Solomon Strickland's will was written August 8, 1843, and was probated in Henry County on November 6, 1843. It was recorded in Henry County Will Book "A", page 117, and lists the following children: 1. Bedford Strickland, deceased son; 2. Polly Strickland, daughter; 3. Elizabeth Strickland, daughter; 4. Thomas J. Strickland, son; 5. Ephraim Strickland, son; 6. Lee Strickland, son; 7. Solomon Strickland, son; 8. Jane Shoulders, daughter. Children not listed in his will, but known to have been his children were: Barnabas Strickland and Nancy Ann James. Petitioners of a caveat against Solomon's will on May 9, 1844, were: Elijah Strickland; John P. Buckalew and Darkas (Dorcas) his wife; Alfred Buffington (who married a Lavina Strickland); Barnabas Strickland; and John P. James and Nancy Ann his wife.

There are many stories which have been told and retold over the years about Solomon Strickland and his family. I did not include these stories in this short article, because I felt it was more important to present facts which have been documented and leave out the many tales and assumptions. There are still many facts to be documented, as there always will be in each person's lineage, but, hopefully, this compilation of my great-great-great-great grandfather will aid someone else in their search.
